- Dr. Keshava Prasad Singh confirmed about the professional Development allowance for all the faculty and it may be ensured that the faculty contribute back to the institution by way of Consultancy and other such activities
- The expert members were all appreciative of the improvement in the Research Proposal submission to various funding agencies
- Dr. Keshava Prasad Singh advised that a “Letter from the Principal” should reach every Faculty/department every fortnightly enabling a mutual bond created from the grass root level till top level peer team
